

FAGAN FLYERS MINUTES

APRIL 10, 2010

The meeting was called to order by President Dee Fogarty at 12:17. There were 23 members present.

The minutes of the March meeting had been received, and were accepted.

Treasurer Gene Pigford reported that after the expenditure for new recliners for the pilot lounge, that there is a balance of \$3774.74, plus \$100.00 in petty cash. The treasurer's report was accepted.

Dee welcomed John Torta, a former member, who has now renewed his association.

Old Business:

All were welcomed to check out the new recliners, which were recently purchased, and are now in the pilots' lounge.

We have received full credit from the vendor for the loveseat and chairs that were purchased only one year ago, and have not fared well to usage.

The fly-in breakfast is scheduled for May 23. Flyers are available in the lobby. Please take some and distribute them. A sign-up sheet is also being circulated. Please sign up to help. A new coffee maker has been purchased and received. It replaces one that was no longer working.

New Business:

Our old vacuum cleaner no longer does an adequate job. Gary Pressler has offered to sell us a commercial grade machine, with an 18" width, for the price of the 14" width machine. The 14" machine costs \$399.00; and the 18" machine costs \$499.00. Discussion followed regarding what size machine would best suit our needs. It was finally decided to allocate \$400.00 for the purchase of a new vacuum, after exploring more thoroughly our needs, and various machines.

Dee suggested that, prior to the pancake breakfast that we organize a cleaning day to give a thorough cleaning to the lobby and lounge areas.

Airport manager, Jim Roberts, requested that the front of the counter was in need of repainting.

Mary Braun has graciously agreed to select plants, and plant the window boxes again this year. She will take care of this once danger of frost has past. Hopefully, this will be done before the pancake breakfast.

Fred and Mary Braun will not be able to attend the next meeting. We will determine arrangements for the lunch which will follow the meeting in Mary's absence.

Election of Officers for the coming year. No one contacted Duane about an interest in holding office. In Duane's absence, Dick Doig chaired the elections. No nominations were received from the floor. All current officers had been contacted, and had agreed to continue in their positions. On behalf of the organization, one vote was cast by Secretary Peggy Naumann to reelect the officers for another year.

Dick Doig reported that Oneonta is looking to sell their airport. He emphasized the importance to supporting our airport.

The meeting was adjourned and lunch was served.

Sparks Burrows told the group about the time the Super Constellation, which is parked at Greenwood Lake Airport in New Jersey had its engines restarted. He passed around pictures of the event.
